- 1. anarchy (AN ar kee) <noun> the absence of government; a state of lawlessness After the terrible dictator was overthrown, a state of anarchy set in for several months until the situation stabilized.
- **2. dissonance (DIS uh nuns) <noun>** unrelated or harsh combination of sounds, discord *The rock* band was known for its use of **dissonance** in many of its songs.
- **3. dubious (DOO be us) <adjective>** doubtful; not clear *I am dubious* about the fine print at the bottom of any contract that *I am possibly going to sign*.
- **4. facilitate (fuh SIL eh tate) <verb>** to make less difficult *My new Keurig single cup coffee maker* **facilitates** my morning; it makes a fresh cup of coffee in less than 90 seconds.
- graphic (GRAF ik) <adjective> vivid The video game was known by many for its graphic violence.
- **6. jocular (JOK yu lur) <adjective>** jesting or joking *She was famous for her jocular personality;* she was always making other people laugh.
- **7. misnomer (mis NO mer) <noun>** misnaming, use of a wrong name *Referring to his gun as his "little friend" seems like a bit of a misnomer.*
- **8. prudent (PROOD unt) <adjective>** wise and careful about practical matters *He was very* **prudent** in managing his money.
- 9. pulverize (PUL vuh rize) <verb> to reduce into small pieces, to demolish *The old building was demolished by the wrecking ball.*
- **10. recapitulate (ree kuh PICH uh leyt) <verb>** to review by a brief summary, as at the end of a speech or discussion; to summarize *It is often effective to recapitulate your major ideas at the end of your essay.*
